

# Safe Routes to School (SRTS)

#### Why is this needed?

- Decreased walking/biking to school.
  Increased traffic congestion around schools and local roads.
- Less physical activity contributes to the obesity epidemic in children. Need coordinated effort to make a change.





# SRTS Components

A successful program must be comprehensive:

- Education
  - In-class curriculum.
- Engineering
  - Traffic calming; improved facilities.
- Enforcement
- Greater police involvement.
- Encouragement

#### SAFETEA-LU

- Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users Act created a new SRTS program (Section 1404).
- · Three main requirements of the law:
  - Implement SRTS program nationwide
  - Create Clearinghouse
  - Establish Task Force



# Purpose of Program

- To enable and encourage children to walk & bike to school.
- Make biking & walking to school safer and more appealing.





#### Purpose

 Facilitate the planning, development and implementation of projects and activities that will improve safety and reduce traffic, air pollution, and fuel consumption in school vicinity.





#### Program Implementation

- · State DOT responsible for program.
- State DOT must provide full-time coordinator
- Projects must be within approximately 2 miles of a primary or middle school (K - 8 grades).



# Program Implementation


- Two funding categories:
  - Infrastructure Projects (70 90% of funds)
- Non-Infrastructure Projects (10 30% funds)
- State DOTs encouraged to establish competitive application process.
- States may retain some funds to reach disadvantaged communities.
- · Eligible grant recipients include:
  - State, local and regional agencies and non-profits.



# Eligible Projects: Infrastructure

- Planning, design and construction:
  - Sidewalk improvements.
  - -Traffic calming and speed reduction measures.
  - Ped/bike crossing improvements.





### Eligible Projects: Infrastructure

- On-street bike facilities.
- Off-street ped/bike facilities.
- Bike parking facilities.
- Traffic diversion improvements.



### Eligible Projects: Non-Infrastructure

- Public awareness campaigns.
- Outreach to press and community leaders.
- Traffic education and enforcement.





# Eligible Projects: Non-Infrastructure

- Student sessions on ped/bike safety, health, and environment.
- Funding for training, volunteers, and managers of SRTS programs.





#### How Much is Available?

TOTAL = \$612 million:

\$54 million (2005)

\$100 million (2006)

\$125 million (2007)

\$150 million (2008)

\$183 million (2009)





- Apportionments based on school enrollments in elementary and middle schools.
- \$1 million minimum per State per year.



  - Develop information and educational programs.
  - Provide technical assistance.
